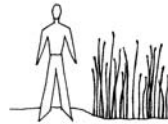
Appearance: Annual or perennial herbs, tufted or creeping; stems unbranched.

Leaves: With sheaths, but no leaf blades, no leaflike bracts.

Flowers: In a single, terminal spike, scales overlapping, usually spiral; stamens 2 - 3.

Fruit: A nutlet, 2-sided or 3-angled, with a definite tubercle at tip, usually with 6 - 9 bristles surrounding the nutlet.

Location:
Occurs in the southwest
and southeast regions
of Florida.
